Provided Further, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.

Provided Further, That the maintenance and operation of said door shall always be subject to the supervision of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering of the City of Detroit.

Provided Further, That the said J. L. Hudson Company shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Detroit from any and all claims for damage to property or injury to persons arising out of the installation, maintenance or operation of said door, and against any expenses which may be incurred by the City of De-

troit in the removal of said door upon termination of the permission herein granted.
