To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The paving of Lernout Avenue from McClellan to Cooper Avenue was completed by the W. P. A. on July 19th, 1941, and assessment roll No. 9672 for Sponsor's Contribution on this paving was confirmed by Common Council on August 19th, 1941.

In connection with this assessment roll, Lots No. 208 and 211 of the Cooper's Subdivision, located on the north and south sides of Lernout Avenue, west of Cooper Avenue, have been erroneously included in the assessment district as these lots do not abut on Lernout Avenue.

On December 14th, 1920, the Common Council confirmed the opening of Lernout Avenue from Cooper Avenue to the alley west of Cooper, ordering the condemnation of two 30 foot lots, No. 209 and No. 210 of Cooper's Subdivision on the west side of Cooper Avenue.

Since Lernout Avenue is only a 50 foot street adjoining this condemnation of 60 foot width, there now remains two small parcels of land belonging to the City as excess condemnation for Lernout Avenue, which abut the street paving instead of Lots No. 208 and No. 211, which were included in the assessment district for paving Lernout Avenue as previously stated.

It is, therefore, recommended that the City Treasurer be authorized and directed to refund the amounts paid by the owners of Lots No. 208 and No. 211 of Cooper's Subdivision appearing on roll No. 9672 for the paving of Lernout Avenue, and cancel the balance of the assessment charged to these lots, in accordance with the attached resolution.

We recommend the adoption of this resolution.
