By Councilman Comstock:

Resolved, That the southerly 60 feet of Glover Avenue and "L" alley first west of Glover Avenue, as platted and opened all south of Edlie Avenue and being a part of Henry P. Glover's Sub. of that part of P. C. 26 described as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the E. line of P. C. 26 and the southerly line of Jefferson Ave.; thence S. 58 degrees 20 min. W. 353.67 ft.; thence S. 24 degrees 52 min. E. 1303.1 ft.; thence N. 63 degrees 04 min. E. 380.51 ft.; thence N. 24 degrees 50 min. W. on E. line P. C. 26, 1,345.53 ft. to point of beginning and containing 10.664 acres, Village of Fairview (now Detroit) Wayne Co., Mich., as recorded in Liber 24, Page 27 of Plats of Wayne County Records and more particularly described as The southerly 60 feet of Glover Avenue, 50 feet wide lying between the easterly line of the southerly 20 feet of lot 35; the easterly line of east and west public alley, 18 feet wide hereinafter described, the easterly line of the southerly 22 feet of lot 34 and the

westerly line of the southerly 20 feet of lot 32; the westerly line of lot 33, all of last mentioned subdivision;

Also, all of east and west public alley, 18 feet wide lying between the northerly line of the southerly 22 feet of lot 34 and the southerly 22 feet of lot 35, all of last mentioned division, being the same property sub-condemned by the City of Detroit for alley purposes in 1926;

Also, all of north and south public alley, 15 feet wide, lying between the easterly line of the southerly 20 feet of lot 98; the easterly line of the northerly 18 feet of lot 99 and the westerly line of east and west public alley, 18 feet wide, heretofore mentioned; the westerly line of the southerly 20 feet of lot 35, all of last mentioned subdivision; be and the same are hereby vacated to become part and parcel of the adjoining property;

Provided, Owners in fee deed to the City of Detroit, the northerly 20 feet of lot 35 of Henry P. Glover's Sub. of that part of P. C. 26 described as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the E. line of P. C. 26 and the southerly line of Jefferson Ave.; thence S. 58 degrees 20 min. W. 353.67 ft.; thence S. 24 degrees 52 min. E. 1,303.1 ft.; thence N. 63 degrees 04 min. E. 380.51 ft.; thence N. 24 degrees 50 min. W. on E. line of P. C. 26, 1,345.53 ft. to point of beginning of Fairview (now Detroit) Wayne and containing 10.664 acres, Village Co., Mich., as recorded in Liber 24, Page 27 of Plats of Wayne County Records; to be used for alley purposes; and further

Provided, Petitioners pay to the City Treasurer, the sum of \$70.00, said amount being the estimate cost to move P. L. C. wires and equipment in connection with the above proposed change of alleys. This work is contingent on the ability of P. L. C. to use material out of their warehouse, under war restrictions, and the continued use of Edison Poles. This amount to be credited to P. L. C. Account No. 9; and further

Provided, Petitioners pay to the City Treasurer, the sum of \$300.00, said amount being the estimate cost of establishing a new 6-inch connection, cut out and move fire hydrant 82 feet north of its present location. This amount to be credited to Moving Hydrants Fire Fund Account No. 12; and further

Provided, Petitioners pay to the City Treasurer the sum of \$100.00, said amount being the estimate cost of the installation of a control valve to be installed in the water main in Glover Avenue north of the area herein vacated; and further

Provided, Petitioners, its successors or assigns assume the maintenance of the existing water pipe within the area herein vacated; and further

Provided, Petitioners deposit with



the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works, the sum of \$781.46, said amount being the estimate cost of grading and paving alley herein dedicated; and further

Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alleys the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the lateral sewers located therein, and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair same; and further

Provided, If a building is constructed over the portion of the north and south public alley herein vacated, the existing sewer under the building is to be replaced by cast iron pipe of same size or encase present sewer in 6 inches of concrete. Plans of Buildings are to be submitted to City Engineer for approval; and further

Provided, Petitioners reimburse the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in said street and/or alleys which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of same or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of said street and/or alleys; and further

Provided, Owners in fee produce an abstract or other satisfactory record showing title to grantor conveying above described property; and further

Provided, All taxes are paid in full on all adjoining property; and further

Provided, Petitioners comply with all provisos herein contained within 30 days from date of this resolution; and further

Resolved, That upon compliance with all of the above provisos, the City Controller be and is hereby directed to issue Quit Claim Deed to National Stamping Company, a Michigan Corporation, as owner in fee of adjoining property.

**ORDINANCE No. 236-D**

**AN ORDINANCE** to repeal Chapter 83 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936, as amended, being an Ordinance restricting Junk Shop Districts.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Chapter 83 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit of 1936, as amended being an Ordinance restricting Junk Shop Districts, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. This ordinance is hereby declared necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Detroit, and is hereby given immediate effect.
