ORDINANCE No. 296-D

(File in container and make notation after Chapter 229 on page 554)

AN ORDINANCE to forbid obstructing the vision of operators of motor buses and street cars.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. No person, having boarded a street car or motor bus, shall so stand or remain therein as to prevent its operator from having, while in his customary posi-tion to operate it, a completely clear, unobstructed view of objects outside the vehicle either ahead of it or to the operator's left or to his right, or from having a completely clear, unobstructed view of the frontmost door of such vehicle.

Sec. 2. Any person, having boarded a street car or motor bus and so standing or remaining therein as to prevent the operator of such vehicle from having the completely clear, unobstructed views described in Section 1, shall, upon request of the operator, promptly so remove himself from such position as to afford the operator such views.

Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisonment in the Detroit House of Correction for a period not ex-ceeding ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Sec. 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and is hereby given immediate effect.
