To the Honorable, the Common  
 Council:

Gentlemen—From time to time  
 during the current fiscal year, this  
 Department has been called upon to  
 assume the expense for providing  
 convalescent care for indigent resi-  
 dents of the City of Detroit who have  
 been admitted to the Central Hospital  
 in an emergency through authoriza-  
 tion of the City Physician's Division.

The Public Welfare Commission has  
 recently entered into a formal con-  
 tract with this hospital for this ser-  
 vice to cover the period from July 1,  
 1942 to January 31, 1943, at the rate  
 of \$1.75 per day, which contract will  
 be forwarded to your Honorable Body  
 for approval within the next few days.  
 However, as a considerable portion of  
 this emergency service was rendered  
 by the Central Hospital during the  
 months of September and October,  
 1942, the Public Welfare Commission  
 respectfully requests your approval to  
 the payment of the enclosed voucher  
 amounting to \$995.75 at the next  
 session of your Honorable Body.
