AN ORDINANCE to amend Ordinance No. 115-D, entitled "An Ordinance to regulate traffic, to provide a penalty for the violation thereof, and to repeal Chapter 196 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for 1936, as amended, and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances contravening the provisions of this ordinance," by adding a new Section thereto to be known as Section 76.
