VACATION OF ALLEY

Resolved, That all of east and west public alley in block bounded by Greenlawn Avenue, Woodingham Drive, St. Martins and Pembroke Avenues more particularly described as all of said east and west public alley 20 feet wide lying between the southerly line of Lots 1 to 7 both inclusive and the northerly line of Lot 8, all of Adridge Subdivision of the E. ½ of the E. ½ of the N. E. ¼ of the S. W. ¼ of Sec. 4, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 83, Page 17 of Plats of Wayne County Records. Be and the same is hereby vacated to become part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, Petitioner deposit with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$36.00, said amount being the estimate cost for the construction of sidewalk on the east side of Greenlawn Avenue within the lines of the alley herein vacated, and further

Provided, that by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the lateral sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair same and further Provided, That no buildings or structures of any kind whatsoever (except the necessary line fences dividing said lots) shall be built or placed over said sewer, and further

Provided; That all provisos herein contained be complied with within 30 days from the date of this resolution, and further

Resolved, That upon compliance with the above provisos the City Controller be and he is hereby di-

rected to issue Quit Claim Deed to the State of Michigan as owner in fee of adjoining property, and further Resolved, That upon receipt of proper evidence that all taxes are paid on the abutting property, the City Engineer be and he is hereby directed to release said deeds.

Mayor's Capital Improvement Program Committee

September 8, 1943.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Pursuant to requests from the Common Council that all changes and additions and deductions in the Capital Improvement and Advance Plan Programs be submitted to this honorable body for their consideration, the Mayor's Capital Improvement Program Committee begs to submit the following matters along with the recommendations of this Committee:

1. Department of Parks and Recreation:

a. The refectories which were 40'x40' with an eight foot porch on three sides and were to cost \$12,000 for construction and \$3,000 for equipment, are, to take care of added and necessary storage facilities, changed to 40'x55' with an eight foot walk on three sides, and cost of \$22,000 for construction and \$3,000 for equipment.

The Committee recommends the adoption of this change.

b. The Department of Public Works is to proceed with the Preparation of Plans and Specifications for a Swimming Pool in Algonquin, Riverside and Jayne Parks, same being now set up in the Advance Plan Program under Group III—projects suitable for Advance Preparation of Plans and Specifications. No change or alterations.

The Committee recommends the adoption of the above procedure.

2. The Zoological Park Commission: Under date of July 31, 1943, the Zoological Park Commission submitted a revised list of Capital Improvement Program Projects. The following items are in the Advance Plan Program and have been changed as follows:

a. Commissary Building at \$75,000. (Project description and Need: Reinforced concrete and gunite stucco structure, 50'x100'x24' high with Mezzanine floor, Heating plant, refrigeration, alleys for various uses, skylights, windows, ventilators, large truck doors, each end. Hay and grain stored in rat infested buildings, part of space required by Parks and Rec-
