AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 3 of Chapter 56 of the Compiled Or-dinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1936.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Chapter 56 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1936, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Every person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of conducting or maintaining a hotel, rooming house or public lodging house, shall make application in writing to the Mayor for a license for such purpose, which application shall state the street number or location and the place where such business is to be conducted. Such application shall also contain an agreement upon the part of the applicant that he will comply with the

terms of this ordinance and that he will promptly notify the Police Department of the City of Detroit of the presence of any minors under the presence of age houses seventeen (17) years of age housed or located in such establishment or notated unless with the consent or knowledge of the parent or guardian of such

The fees for such licenses shall be as follows:

- (a) 100 rooms or less, \$40.00 annually.
- (b) 101 to 500 rooms, \$75.00 annually.
- (c) Over 500 rooms, \$100.00 annually.
