By Councilman Comstock:

Resolved, That all that part of north and south public alley, 18 feet wide, in block bounded by Field, Sheridan, Gratiot and Farnsworth Avenues, and more particularly described as all that part of north and south public alley, 18 feet wide, as platted in Chapoton's Subdivision of lot 14, Block 1, of John S. Foley's Subdivision of part of the Church

Farm, P. C. 16, Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 22 Page 88 of plats of Wayne County Records, lying between the easterly line of lots 8 to 10 both inclusive, and the westerly line of lots 2 and 3 and the westerly line of the northerly 30 feet of lot 1, all lots as platted in last mentioned subdivision.

Also, all that part of north and south public alley, above described, as established by Common Council resolution of March 9, 1926, J. C. C. page 623, and being in fact the easterly 6 feet of lot 8 and the westerly 6 feet of lot 3, both as platted in Chapoton's Subdivision, heretofore mentioned.

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, owners in fee deed to the City of Detroit for alley purposes the following described property: All that part of lot 1 of Chapoton's Subdivision of lot 14, Block 1, of John S. Foley's Subdivision of part of the Church Farm, P. C. 16, Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 22 Page 88 of plats of Wayne County Records, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point in the westerly line of lot 1 of last mentioned subdivision, said point being 30 feet southerly of the northerly line of said lot 1, thence on a line in the southeasterly direction, said line making an angle of 45 degrees with the westerly line of said lot 1, 16.97 feet to a point; thence along a line in the southerly direction, said line being parallel to said westerly line of said lot, 10.46 feet to a point; thence along a line in an easterly direction, said line being at right angles with the last described line, 14.48 feet to a point in the southerly line of said lot 1, said point also being in the northerly line of east and west public alley, 20 feet wide; thence along the northerly line of said alley in a southwesterly direction, 33.40 feet to a point in the westerly line of said lot 1; thence northerly along said westerly line of said lot 1, 42.37 feet to the place of beginning, and further,

Provided, petitioners deposit with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$110.00, said sum being the estimated cost of grading and improving the portion of alley herein dedicated, and further

Provided, petitioners reimburse the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now installed in alley herein vacated which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of the same or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities which it may be ne-

necessary to relocate or reroute due to said vacation, and further,

Resolved, That upon compliance with the above provisos the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to issue a Quit Claim deed to Edward Mooney, Roman Catholic Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit as owner in fee of the adjoining property.
