Drake Jewelry Co., 201 Gratiot Ave., to erect two Christmas trees, approx. 10 ft. high, on marquee on the Library Ave. side of building, and maintain same from Nov. 15, 1945 to Jan. 2, 1946.

Ernst Kern Co., 1030 Woodward Ave. to erect a flat sign, approx 17 ft. wide at base and 101½ ft. high, against the cut-off corner of building, and maintain same until Jan. 2, 1946.

By Councilman Sweeney:

Resolved, That all that part of north and south public alley, 18 feet wide, in block bounded by Bishop, Grayton, Cornwall and Warren Avenues, more particularly described as all that part of north and south

public alley, 18 feet wide, as platted in Volkenning, Overfield and Lyons subdivision of the southerly portion of lot 6, P. C. 585, Township of Grosse Pointe, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 16, Page 35 of plats of Wayne County Records, and as established by condemnation (verdict confirmed by Court on May 20, 1929 and referred to Common Council on June 4, 1929), the easterly 9 feet of above described alley being the same as that platted in last mentioned subdivision and lying west of and adjoining the westerly line of the northerly 17.45 feet of lot 131, west of and adjoining the westerly line of lots 132 to 146, both inclusive, all of last mentioned subdivision; the westerly 9 feet of above mentioned 18 foot north and south public alley being the easterly 9 feet of the alley established by the above mentioned condemnation, which easterly 9 feet lies east of and adjoining the easterly line of that part of public alley which was vacated by Common Council resolution on December 31, 1929, J. C. C. page 3602, the westerly 9 feet of said public alley vacated by Common Council resolution of Dec. 31, 1929 being the same as that platted in Charles L. Poupard subdivision of part of P. C. 111, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 61 page 55 of plats of Wayne County Records; said entire 18 foot north and south public alley above described also lying between the northerly line of Cornwall Avenue as now established and a line, said line being the northerly line of lot 146 (extended westerly 18 feet) of Volkenning, Overfield and Lyon subdivision of the southerly portion of lot 6, P. C. 585, Township of Grosse Pointe, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 16 Page 35 of plats of Wayne County Records,

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley and converted into an 18 foot public easement, which easement shall be subjected to the following agreements, covenants, uses, reservations and regulations which shall be observed by the owners of said lots and by their grantees and assigns and their heirs, executors and administrators and assigns forever, to-wit:

First said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated north and south alley above described for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing, or replacing any sewer, conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light, or other poles or things usually placed or installed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easement for the purposes above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any kind whatsoever (except the necessary line fences) shall be built or placed upon said easement or any part thereof so that said easement shall be forever of easy access for the purposes named above;

Third, that said easement shall be used for the same purposes for which public alleys are generally used in the City of Detroit, excepting the same shall not be opened for the passage of vehicles therein, and further,

Provided, that by reason of the vacation of the above described alley the City of Detroit does not waive any rights in the lateral sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair same, and further,

Provided, petitioners reimburse the owners to the extent of the value of any utilities now established in said alley which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of said alley or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to said conversion into easement, and further,

Provided, petitioners deposit with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$241.10, said sum being the estimated cost of removing existing paved alley return on the north side of Cornwall, and reconstructing curbing and sidewalks in connection with said removal, and further,

Resolved, That upon compliance with the above provisos the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to issue Quit Claim deeds to Ernest L. Reas and Gladys Reas, his wife; Lester G. Young; Frederick R. Coe and Edith A. Coe, his wife; W. Ray Heitman and Irene M. Heitman, his wife; Ida M. Poupard; Albert G. Young and Anna M. Young, his wife; John Wm. Baker and Hazel B. Baker, his wife; Lee C. Fowle and Jean B. Fowle, his wife; Lee E. Winters and Jean K. Winters, his wife; Fred R. Walker and Lucille C. Walker, his wife; Daniel R. Webb and Marvel Jeanne Webb, his wife; Edward Vertommen and Gabrielle Vertommen, his wife; Charles A. Abbey and Clara H. Abbey, his wife; Russel C. Gellasch and Grace Gellasch, his wife; Frank H. Wilson and Jean S. Wilson, jointly and not as tenants in common; Frank H. Wilson and Jean S. Hadfield, as joint tenants and not as tenants in common; Forist Eades and Alma R. Eades, his wife; Odey Rex Lucas and Ruth S. Lucas, his wife; Peter Mandos and Zanthly Mandos, his wife; and the Travelers Insurance Company, a Connecticut

Corporation; as owners in fee of the adjoining property, and further,

Resolved, That upon receipt of proper evidence that all taxes are paid on the abutting property the City Engineer be and he is hereby directed to release said deeds.

Resolved, that all that part of north and south public alley, 20 feet wide, lying first easterly of Springwells Avenue and southerly of the M. C. R. R. right-of-way and more particularly described as all that part of north and south public alley, 20 feet wide, as platted in plat of subdivision of P. C. 718 for the heirs of the late Leonard Lennox of Springwells, as recorded in Liber 68, Page 111 of Deeds, Wayne County Records, and lying between the easterly line of Outlot 17 as platted in last mentioned subdivision and the westerly line of lot 1 of Alexander Weber's Subdn. of lot 15 and that part of lot 16 south of M. C. R. R. of Sub. of P. C. 718, Springwells, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 18, Page 43 of Plats of Wayne County Records, said alley also lying between the southerly line of the M. C. R. R. right-of-way and the easterly line of Springwells Avenue, 66 feet wide as now established,

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

Provided, petitioners pay into the City Treasury the sum of \$200.00, said sum being the estimated cost of relocating a Dept. of Water Supply 4 inch shut off valve located in alley herein vacated, said amount to be credited to Dept. of Water Supply Fund Code No. 601-9300-0-508, and further,

Provided, that if at any time in the future it becomes necessary to remove existing paved alley return at

alley herein vacated and to reconstruct the curbing and sidewalks incidental with such removal, the entire cost of such work shall be borne by the petitioners, their heirs, executors or assigns, in accordance with their letter on file with the original petitions, and further,

Resolved, that upon compliance with the above provisos the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to issue a Quit Claim deed to the Detroit Packing Company, a Michigan Cooperative Corporation, as owner in fee of the adjoining property, and further,

Resolved, that upon receipt of proper evidence that all taxes are paid on the abutting property, the City Engineer be and he is hereby directed to release said deed.
