The petitioners have requested that the paved alley return on the east side of Ellery Street, South of Forest Ave. remain in its present location as a means of ingress and egress to their property and have submitted a letter, filed with the original petition guaranteeing payment of all costs incidental to the removal and reconstruction of said return at any time in the future that it becomes necessary to remove said return All other City Departments and

private utilities reported that they will not be adversely affected by the vacation of said alley or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioners regarding their installations therein.

In view of the above, we recom-mend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Page 64 of plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the northerly line of lot 20 of last mentioned subdivision, be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.

November 20, 1946. To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen — Lateral Sewer 6386, now under construction, is for the blocks bounded by Kentfield, Ever-green, Clarita, and 7 Mile Road. This lateral sewer connects to and becomes an integral part of a lateral sewer system which had previously been constructed.

After the contract was awarded and the construction work under way, it was found necessary to increase the size of a section of the sewer in order to accommodate a

work now being constructed. This change in size has increased the contract price by the amount of \$1,428.30, from the original amount of \$11,986.25 to \$13,414.55.

The change in size of the portion of Lateral Sewer 6386 is being made at approximately the unit prices of the original proposal. The cost, therefore, is not above that which would have been bid had the actual field conditions been known at the time.

It is respectfully requested that your Honorable Body approve increase, in the amount of \$1,428.30. to Contract PW-133, Tri-City Excavating Company, Contractor.
