To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The City Plan Commission has approved petition of Martin Electric Company (No. 8345) requesting the vacation of a portion of an east and west public alley south of Outer Drive and east of Conley Avenue, and said petition was then referred by your Committee of the Whole to the Department of Public Works for investigation and report.

We wish to report that all investigations have been completed and we find no city departments affected by the proposed vacation. We have received word from the Detroit Edison Company, the only private utility affected, that they have reached a satisfactory agreement with the petitioner regarding their installations in this alley.

In view of the above, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Resolved, That all that part of east and west public alley, 18 feet wide, located south of Outer Drive and east of Conley Avenue, more particularly described as all that part of east and west public alley, 18 feet wide, as platted in Clairmount Park Subdivision No. 1, being part of the W. 1/2 of the E. 1/2 of Sec. 5, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 62, page 95 of plats of Wayne County Records, lying south of and adjoining the southerly line of the easterly 21.21 feet of lot 675 of last mentioned subdivision, said alley also lying east of the easterly line extended northerly of 18 foot north and south public alley which lies first east of and parallel to Conley Avenue,

Hathon at the request of the parties interested for the purpose of being recorded February 4th, 1840, as recorded in Liber 10, Pages 715, 716 and 717 of City Records, Wayne County Records, and being a portion of public alley opened by condemnation, which condemnation was confirmed by Court on October 21, 1868.
