The vacation of this portion of Lemay Avenue was previously approved and recommended by the City line 246.52 ft. northerly of and par-Plan Commission in their communi-

recommendation that certain propcrties acquired by the City of Detroit through tax foreclosure be allocated to the Board of Education to add to their playground facilities for South. eastern High School. Also, a portion of said land acquired by foreclosure was to be allocated for alley purposes.

We wish to advise that all of our investigations have been completed. We are in receipt of a Quit Claim deed from the Board of Education to the City of Detroit dedicating a portion of their property east of Lemay Avenue for turn-around purposes.

This department notified the Board of Education of the extent to which all City departments and private utilities would be affected by the proposed closing of said street.
