W. 14.11 feet to a point; thence N. 60d. 41m. 50s. E., 12.39 feet to a point; thence along a line N. 6d. 40m. 40s. W., 60.96 feet to the place of beginning, to be used for alley purposes.

Also the northerly 12 feet of lot 100 of Wallace Bros. Subdivision on N. W. 1/4 of N. W. 1/4 of Sec. 29, Greenfield T. 1 S., R. 11 E., Wayne Co., Michigan, as recorded in Liber 27, Page 52 of Plats, Wayne County Records, to be used as an easement for public utilities, of the same purposes for utilities, for the same purposes for which public alleys are generally used in the City of Detroit excepting that the same shall not be opened for the regular traffic of vehicles and/or pedestrians."

Be and the same is hereby accepted and the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to record said deed in the office of the Register of Deeds for Wayne County.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee of the Whole referred petition of Julius A. Szabo and Elmer J. Barkell (Pet. No. 1613) requesting the vacation of an 18 foot east and west public alley lying first southerly of Orangelawn Avenue between Auburn and Minock Avenues, and the establishing of an easement in lieu thereof, to the Department of Public Works for further investigation and report.

This change has been previously approved and recommended by the City Plan Commission in their communication to your Honorable Body of October 1, 1946.

We wish to advise that all of our investigations have been completed. We are in receipt of satisfactory agreements executed by the owners in fee of the property abutting the alley proposed to be vacated granting the City of Detroit easement rights to said alley, said easements having been approved as to form and execution by the Corporation Counsel.

All City departments and private utilities reported that they will not

be adversely affected by the vacation of this alley or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioners regarding their installations therein.

The conversion of this alley into an easement conforms with Common Council resolution of November 13, 1945, J.C.C. page 2230.

In view of the above, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.
