Gentlemen-Your Committee of the Whole referred petition of Manuel M. Hartman, et al (No. 3768), requesting the vacation of the 16 foot east and west public alley first north of Grand River Avenue between Burgess and Chapel Avenues to the Department of Public Works for investigation and

The vacation of this alley was previously approved by the City Plan Commission with the recommendation that the petitioners dedicate a parcel of land for alley purposes to be used in lieu of the alley vacated.

We wish to advise that all of our investigations have been completed.

We are in receipt of a warranty deed from Thomas J. Joyce, Jr. and Lucille S. Joyce, his wife, deeding land for alley purposes in accordance with recommendation of City Plan Commission and we are submitting it herewith for your Honorable Body's acceptance. Said deed was approved as to form and execution by the Corporation Counsel and as to description by the City Engineer.
On September 17, 1947, the petitioners deposited into the City Treas-

ury the sum of \$2,650.00, Receipt No. 20746, credited to Public Lighting Commission Fund Code No. 123-9300-0 6190-481, said amount being the estimated cost of removing that department's street lighting equipment structures, necessitated by vacation of said alley.
