showing the status of agreement negetiations with all the Railroads for a program of improved crossing protection as of this date.

The following report refers to specific construction progress that has been made during the current week.

Pere Marquette Railway: The protection installations at the Joy Road and Livernois crossings on this Railroad's West Detroit Branch Line were practically fully completed this past week and were placed in on Wednesday, November 12th, at 10:00 A. M. The crew has been engaged in painting and guard rail construction the rest of the week. We are informed by the Railroad's Asst. Signal Engineer, Mr. Anderson, that work will be resumed on the Main Line-Greenfield crossing the first of next week.

York Central Railroad: It is reported that signal gangs have been working on the new protection installations scheduled for Central and Lonyo Avenues Main Line crossings and at Mellon Avenue on the Junction Yard Branch Line. Very satisfactory progress is noted for all three of these jobs and no further delays will be experienced in promptly completing these improvements, inasmuch as necessary materials and equipment are now on hand.

No further progress has been occasioned at the Mt. Elliott crossing due to the same reason as reported one week ago.

Terminal Railroad: though four carloads of material have been received, the individual crossing orders are not complete and in consequence, some delay is being caused in the progress of the two field in-stallations started three weeks ago at E. Vernor Highway and at E. Warren Avenue. Electric cable is lacking for both thees jobs, and also the conduit pipe for E. Warren. The completion progress was advanced 1 per cent at Vernor and not at all at The supervisor Warren last week. in charge of the work expects faster progress will result in the next few weeks when needed materials will The suppliers are furnishing the electric cable circuits which are completely fabricated as a unit in the factory per the specifications of each individual location. This fact is, in great part, accountable for the slow made slow progress being presently made
