Gentlemen-We are returning herewith petition filed by the Department of Parks and Recreation requesting the vacation of Britain Avenue between Kelly Road and Duchess Ave-

The vacation of said street was approved by the City Plan Commission in their communication to your Honorable Body of June 3, 1948, with the recommendation that sufficient land be set aside from the recently acquired playground site at the above location to widen Kelly Road and Duchess Avenue to correspond to the widths of these streets northerly and southerly of the playground site. Your Committee of the Whole concurred in said recommendations and referred the petition to this office for investigation and report.

Please be advised that all of our investigations have been completed.
