Gentlemen-Attached hereto is a tabulation showing the status of the entire program for improved crossing protection throughout the City area as of this date.

The following is a report on the progress of crossing protection installations currently under way for the period between November 1st and December 1st.

Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad (Pere Marquette): With the recent completion of the work of installing shortarm gates and modernized flashers at the Warren Avenue crossing of the West Detroit Branch line of this railroad, the 1948 program, as agreed upon, has been finished. This particular protection was placed in operation on December 3rd at 3:00 P. M.

A total of ten crossing have been improved to date with respect to mechanized protection since the start of the work in 1947.

Grand Trunk Western Railroad: The installation of the short-arm gate and flasher signal protection at the Van Dyke Avenue crossing was completed and placed in service on November 19, 1948. This protection was furnished at no cost to the City by virtue of an agreement between the Michigan State Highway Department and the railroad, and all maintenance costs in connection with this improvement are to be assumed entirely by the Grand Trunk.

Detroit Terminal Railroad: No further progress towards the completion of the railroad signalization at Dequindre was possible last month pending the Traffic Bureau's installations of co-ordinating street signals at the nearby intersection of E. McNichols City of Detroit, with the right to in- and Dequindre. This latter work will
