Department of Public Works

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee of the Whole referred petition of Great Lakes Greyhound Lines, Inc., (No. 7741) requesting the vacation of certain public alleys east of 17th Street between Lafayette and Fort Streets, to the Department of Public Works for investigation and report.

The vacation of these alleys was previously approved and recommended by the City Plan Commission in their communication to your Honorable Body of December 26, 1947.

Please be advised that all of our investigations have been completed.

On January 16, 1947, the petitioners paid into the City Treasury the sum of \$101.49, Receipt No. 43436, credited to Public Works Maintenance Fund, Code No. 143-6221-1, to reimburse the City of Detroit for the original cost of paving Lafayette and 17th Streets at the intersection of the alleys requested to be vacated.

All other City departments and private utility companies reported that

they will be unaffected by the vacation of said alleys.

In view of the above, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

C. 473 known as the Stanton Farm, as recorded in Liber 47 of deeds, Pages 558 and 559, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the north line of lots 23 and 24, and south of and adjoining the south line of lot 35 and south of and adjoining the south line of 10 foot north and south public alley, hereinafter described, all lots being the same as platted in last mentioned subdivision;
