To the Honorable, the Common  
 Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning here-  
 with petition No. 7798, filed by Ed-  
 ward Mooney, Roman Catholic Arch-  
 bishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit,  
 requesting the vacation of Fenmore,  
 Archdale and Harlow Avenues south  
 of Outer Drive, and the vacation of  
 the alleys south of and parallel to  
 Outer Drive between Fenmore and  
 Oakfield Avenues.

The vacation of said streets and  
 alleys was approved and recommend-  
 ed by the City Plan Commission in  
 their communication to your Honor-  
 able Body of February 18, 1948. The  
 petition was then referred to this  
 office by your Committee of the  
 Whole for investigation and report.

Please be advised that all of our  
 investigations have been completed.

On May 12, 1948, the petitioner  
 deposited into the City Treasury the  
 sum of \$40.00, Receipt No. 56840,  
 credited to the Public Lighting Com-  
 mission Fund Code No. 123-9400-0,  
 6190-481 to cover the cost of removing  
 P.L.C. structures necessitated by the  
 vacation of said streets.

The petitioner has requested that  
 the paved street returns at the en-  
 trance to the streets requested to be  
 vacated on the south side of Outer  
 Drive, remain in their present status  
 as a means of ingress and egress  
 to their property, and have submitted  
 a letter, filed with the original peti-  
 tion, guaranteeing the payment of all  
 costs incidental to the removal and  
 reconstruction of said paved returns,  
 if at any time in the future, at the  
 City's request or at the request of  
 the petitioner, it becomes necessary  
 to remove and reconstruct said re-  
 turns.

All other City Departments and  
 private utility companies reported  
 that they will be unaffected by the  
 vacation of above mentioned streets  
 and alleys.

In view of the above, we recom-  
 mend the adoption of the attached  
 resolution.

Gentlemen—This is to certify, in accordance with Article 5 of the paving contract, P. W. 331, that the work provided for in said contract has been fully performed and the Contractor, Julius Porath and Son Company, have submitted an affidavit that all payrolls, material bills, and other indebtedness connected with the work have been paid.
