investigations have been completed.

As per our directive, on April 12, the petitioners deposited into the City Treasurer the sum of \$105.00, Receipt No. 49306, credited to Department of Water Supply Fund Code No. 601-9300-0-6290-908, said amount being the estimated cost of work to be done in connection with the abandonment of an 8" water main in the portion of street to be vacated.

On April 12, 1949, the petitioners paid to the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$168.00, Receipt No. 89952, said amount being the estimated cost of constructing sidewalks on the west side of Volte Avenue across the portion of vacated street.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies re-ported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of above mentioned Keal Avenue, or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioners regarding their installations therein.

Groups 3 and 4 taken March 15th. The average of the bids in Group 10 for 26 ft. width streets is the second highest received this season. The highest is \$5.643 for Groups 1 and 2 taken March 8th.

However, all the bids received with the exception of two are below the City Engineer's previous estimate. On Contract PW-806, Bruckner, the lowest bid of the three received is approximately 8 percent above the City Engineer's estimate and results in asesssment cost per front ft. of \$6.149. On Contract PW-868, Appoline, the lowest bid of the five received is approximately 5 per cent above the City Engineer's estimate and results in an assesment cost per front foot of \$8.346. This contract is only 200 feet in length.
