vestigations have been completed. We are in receipt of a quit claim deed to land to be used for alley purposes in accordance with City Plan Commission's recommendation. Said deed was approved as to form and execution by the Corporation Counsel and as to description by the City Engineer, and it is attached hereto

for your Honorable Body's acceptance.
