To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of William Stevenson, et al, No. 5590, requesting the vacation of Minerva Avenue, west of University Avenue. The vacation of this portion of dead-end street was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was referred to this office by your committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

Please be advised that all of our investigations have been completed.

As per our directive, on July 5, 1950, the petitioners paid into the City Treasury the sum of \$317.75, Receipt No. 31666, credited to Public Works Maintenance Fund Code No. 143-6221-1, to reimburse the City for the original cost of paving the west ½ of University Avenue at the intersection of the street to be vacated.

Proper provisions are incorporated in the vacating resolution protecting the City's interests in the storm sewer located in the portion of street to be vacated.

In reply to our inquiries all other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of the street or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioners regarding their installations therein.

In view of the above, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Resolved, That all of Minerva Avenue, 60 feet wide, west of University Avenue, as platted in Kelly's Harper Avenue Subdivision of lots 43 and 56 of the plat of addition to the Rivard Park Subdivision of P.C.'s 299 and 458, as recorded in Liber 48 of Plats, Page 96, Wayne County Records, lying between the south line of lot 15 and the north line of lot 16, both lots being the same as platted in last mentioned subdivision.

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public street to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property subject to the following provisions:

1. Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described street, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the sewer located therein, and at all times shall have the right

to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair, alter or service same, and further

2. Provided, That if a building is to be constructed over said sewer, the sewer shall be replaced with cast iron pipe of the same size, rerouted or encased in six inches of Class "A" concrete, or, in lieu of the above, such work shall be done as will be specified by the City Engineer, all of the work mentioned to be done under the supervision and inspection of the Department of Public Works and all costs entailed to be borne by the petitioners, their heirs or assigns, and further,

3. Provided, That no buildings shall be constructed over said sewer without the prior approval of such building construction by the City Engineer and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering.
