Department of Public Works May 14, 1951. Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—The petition of the Department of Parks and Recreation requesting the vacation of certain streets and alleys within the limits of the Geo. H. Connor Playfield was referred to this office by Your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report and is returned herewith.

The City Plan Commission approved the vacation of the streets and alley with the recommendation that certain land be allocated for the widening of Cadieux Avenue and the alley north of Warren Avenue.

Our investigations are completed and they disclose that several City Departments are affected by the changes.

The Department of Water Supply and the Sewer Division of the Department of Public Works agreed to waive any charges provided proper provisions are incorporated in the vacating resolution protecting their interests in the water main and sewer located in the street and alley to be vacated.

The Fire Department agreed to the retension of a fire hydrant within the vacated area as per the petitioner's request, on the condition that free and unobstructed use thereof may be had at all times. The Department of Parks and Recreation agreed to locate their fence in a manner which would not enclose the hydrant.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the changes or that they would remove their installations at no cost to the Department of Parks and We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.
