Resolved, That said bids shall remain firm until the special assessment district for the respective pavings have been determined; and be it further

Resolved, That thereupon the Commissioner of Public Works be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into contracts with the respective bidders listed above in accordance with the proposals, plans and specifications, subject to confirmation and approval by the Common Council; and be it further

Resolved, That payment will be made to the contractors for the assessed portion of the contract only from special assessments levied for said purpose; or from the proceeds of the sale of special assessment bonds and that payment for City portion shall be paid from the street and alley intersection fund within the General Fund. Partial or periodic payments during the course of construction shall not be authorized unless such assessments have been collected or special assessment bonds sold and delivered; and be it further

Resolved, That in the preparation of the City Engineer's final cost statement for payment of the contract cost of new paving of streets and alleys, any deductions or additions to the original contract shall be adjusted in the City portion of the contract, so that the original assessment roll previously confirmed and levied shall not be changed; Provided, That when such deduction or addition in the assessment portion exceed 1 percent of the contract price thereof, this procedure must be approved by the Common Council.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee of the Whole referred to this office for investigation and report the petition of the Department of Parks and Recreation requesting the vacation of Greenview Avenue, between Wadsworth and Capitol Avenues, within the limits of a recreational site. The vacation of said street was previously approved by the City Plan Commission.

Our investigations disclose that the only City department affected by the vacation of said street is the Department of Water Supply. An easement is reserved for this department in the vacating resolution protecting its interests in the water main located in said street.

The vacation of the street will permit a more efficient use of the park property by combining the two parcels which presently are on the east and west sides of Greenview Avenue.

We recommend adoption of attached resolution.

Resolved, That all of Greenview Avenue, 60 feet wide, between Wadsworth and Capitol Avenues, as platted in Lashley-Cox Land Company's Plymouth and Mill Road Subdivision of the S. ½ of the S. E. ¼ of Section 26, T. 1 S., R. 10 E., as recorded in Liber 50 of plats, Page 61, Wayne County Records, lying east of and adjoining the east line of lots 302 to 315, both inclusive, and west of and adjoining the west line of lots 350 to 363, both inclusive, of last mentioned subdivision, be and the same is hereby vacated as a public street to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property subject to the following provisions:

1. An easement or right-of-way is hereby reserved in and over the west 26 feet of said vacated Greenview Avenue for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, replacing or removing the presently installed water main or its appurtenances; and be it further

2. No buildings shall be constructed over said easement (unless prior approval therefor is obtained from the Department of Water Supply) so that it shall be of easy access for the purposes named above.

### Department of Public Works

Honorable Common Council:  
Gentlemen—The petition of the Department of Parks and Recreation requesting the vacation of the alleys in blocks bounded by Penrod, Rosemont, Weaver and Elmira Avenues, within the limits of a recreational site, was referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report and is returned herewith. The vacation of said alleys was previously approved by the City Plan Commission.

Our investigations are completed and they disclose that only one City department, the Sewer Division of the Department of Public Works, is affected by the vacation of said alleys. Proper provisions are incorporated in the vacating resolution protecting said department's interests in the sewers located in the alleys.

As the vacation of the alleys is necessary for the proper utilization of the recreational site, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Resolved, That all of the public alleys, 18 feet wide, in block bounded by Penrod, Rosemont, Weaver and Elmira Avenues, as platted in Emerson Park, a subdivision of part of the N. E. ¼ of Section 35, T. 1 S., R. 10 E., as recorded in Liber 55 of plats, Page 45, Wayne County Records, adjoining lots 350 to 377, both inclusive, of last mentioned subdivision, be and the same are hereby vacated as public alleys to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property subject to the following provisions:

1) Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above described alley, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair, alter or service same; and be it further

2) Provided, That if a building is to be constructed over said sewer, the sewer shall be replaced with cast iron pipe of the same size, rerouted or encased in six inches of Class "A" concrete, or, in lieu of the above, such work shall be done as will be specified by the City Engineer, all under the supervision and inspection of the Department of Public Works and all costs entailed to be borne by the petitioners, their successors or assigns; and be it further

3) Provided, That no buildings shall be constructed over said sewer without the prior approval of such building construction by the City Engineer.
