Honorable Common Council:
Gentlemen — The petition of the Tann Corporation (Petition No. 3659), requesting the vacation of the alleys in block bounded by Mt. Elliott, Filer, Lantz Avenues, and Outer Drive, was referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report. The vacation of said alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission in their communication to your Honorable Body of September 21, 1950.

We wish to advise that all of our investigations are completed. As per our directive, on March 9, 1951 the petitioners deposited with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$125.00, Receipt No. 20335, said amount being the estimated cost of constructing sidewalks on the north side of Lantz Avenue and the west side of Filer Avenue, at the intersections of the alleys to be vacated.

In reply to our inquiries, all other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of the alleys or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioners regarding their installations therein.

In view of the above, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Elliott Avenue Subn. of part of N.E. 1/4 of S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 4, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 56 of plats, Page 79, Wayne County Records, lying west of and adjoining the west line of lots 57 to 68, both inclusive, and east of and adjoining the east line of lots 69 to 88, both inclusive, of last mentioned subn.;

Also, all that part of north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, in block bounded by Mt. Elliott, Filer, Lantz Avenues, and Outer Drive, as platted in Cummiskey-Kehoe Outer Drive Subn., heretofore mentioned, lying west of and adjoining the west line of the south 20 feet of lot 22 of last mentioned subn.;

Be and the same are hereby vacated as public alleys to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property.
