Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of the Memorial Hall Commission requesting the vacation of Griswold Street, south of Atwater Street, the vacation of Atwater Street between Woodward Avenue and Bates Street, and the vacation of the alleys in the block south of Atwater Street, between Woodward Avenue and Bates Street. The vacation of said streets and alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was referred to this office by your Committee of the whole for investigation and report.

Our investigations are completed and they disclose that the Department of Water Supply, the Fire Department, Police Department and the Department of Public Works have substantial installations affected by the proposed vacations and reimbursement to said Departments involve large sums of money. As in the past, the matter of reimbursing the City Departments affected can be disposed of at such time as the affected Department is requested by the Memorial Hall Commission to relocate its facilities. The Detroit Edison Company and the Michigan Bell Telephone Company agreed to remove and reroute their installations at their own expense. The Michigan Consolidated Gas Company will likewise be required to relocate its mains.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Gentlemen—This is to certify that in accordance with Article 6 of the Contract Agreement for PW-1071B1, Freud Pumping Station Caisson, that work provided for in this Contract has been given final inspection and has been found fully completed and the Contractor, Kenny Construction Company, has submitted an affidavit that all payrolls, material bills, and other indebtedness connected with the work has been paid.

The completed items and value thereof of this work are:

All Contract Items and Contract Changes—\$931,318.76 (Nine hundred thirty-one thousand three hundred eighteen and 76/100 Dollars).

As the work provided for in this Contract has been completed, it is accepted by the Commissioner of Public Works under the terms and conditions thereof and it is recommended that it be accepted by your Honorable Body and that full payment of the above stated sum of \$931,318.76, less all previous payments as indicated in Estimate No. 11 (Final), be made by the City and
