Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—This is to inform your Honorable Body that on June 25, 1954, two orders were signed by the Honorable Frank FitzGerald, Wayne Circuit Judge, vacating two alleys located in the City of Detroit, as follows:

Wayne Circuit Court, Case No. 276,-  
622—Common Council Pet. No. 8815—  
Alley bounded by:

Southfield Road, Fenmore, Pem-  
broke and Fargo Avenues.

The orders provide that a public easement for public utility purposes be retained in the lands formerly comprising the alleys.
