antee that the flushing and condi-tioning of the backfill will be done at later date. The amount withheld is in excess of the department's esti-mate of the cost of conditioning the trenches which should not be done until weather conditions are favorable.

The Contractor has furnished, an affidavit that all labor, material and other forms of indebtedness against this project have been fully paid. It is therefore recommended that the Contractor be paid \$23,933. less Four Hundred Dollars (\$400) retained as a guarantee, less all previous payments as indicated in Progress Estimate No. 2.
