Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of Joe E. Babey (No. 733), requesting the vacation of a portion of the east-west public alley west of Foster Avenue, between Miller and Selkirk Avenues. The vacation of said portion of alley was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investi-

gations are completed.

A proper provision is incorporated in the vacating resolution protecting the City's interests in the sewer located in the alley to be vacated.

In reply to our inquiries all other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by said vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations in the alley.

Resolved, That all that part of eastwest public alley, 14 feet wide, west of Foster Avenue, between Miller and Selkirk Avenues, as platted in Koscinszko Subdivision of Lots 11, 12, and 15 of the Plat and Survey of the N. ½ of Sec. 28 and the N.E. fraction of Sec. 29, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., Hamtramck Township, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 32, Page 91 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the north line of Lots 145 and 146, and south of and adjoining the south line of Lots 151 and 152 of the last mentioned subdivision, be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley to become a part and parcel of the adjoining property, subject to the following provisions:

1. Provided, That by reason of the vacation of the above-described alley, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the sewer located therein and at all times shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary, on account of said sewer to repair, alter, or service same; and further

2. Provided, That if a building is to be constructed over said sewer, the sewer shall be replaced with cast iron pipe of the same size, rerouted or encased in 6 inches of Class A concrete, or in lieu of the above, such

work shall be done as will be specified by the City Engineer, all of the work mentioned to be done under the supervision and inspection of the Department of Public Works and all costs entailed to be borne by the pentioners, their successors, or assigne; and further

3. Provided, That no buildings shall be constructed over said sewer without the prior approval of such building construction by the City Engineer and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering; and further

4. Provided, In the event that the sewers located in said alley, if built upon, shall break causing damage to any construction above, the petitioner and its assigns, by acceptance of the permit for building over said sewer, waive all claims for damages to such construction and agree to pay all costs incident to the repair of such broken sewer.
