By Councilman Van Antwerp:

AN ORDINANCE to regulate the business of installing and servicing radio and television equipment in the City of Detroit; to provide for the administration and enforcement of this ordinance; to provide for a Board of Examiners and its powers and duties; and to provide a penalty for the violation of the terms thereof.

WHEREAS, the business of selling television and radio service contracts and servicing television and radio receiving apparatus has become the subject of great abuse with the result that the public has been and is being victimized by irresponsible sales methods, unethical and financially unstable service organizations, and inferior installation, maintenance and repairs; and

WHEREAS, it is found necessary for the protection of the public, to enact legislation to prevent such abuses. NOW, THEREFORE,

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance, certain terms used are defined as follows:

- Board—Board of Examiners;
- City—City of Detroit, a municipal corporation;
- Certified Technician—a person who has passed the examination required by the Board;
- Dealer—A person who is a retail vendor of receiving equipment;
- Department—Police Department of the City;
- Distributor—A person who is a wholesale vendor of receiving equipment;
- Person—The word "person" shall mean every natural person, firm, co-partnership, association or corporation and their legal successors.
- Receiving equipment—Radio or television receiving apparatus or a combination of both, and their associated components, including television receiving antenna system.
- Service—The installation, main-
