

line establishing the easement limits, it is determined that a straight line connecting the following points will be sufficient for the purposes for which the easement was given, to-wit:

1. On the south line of Fort Street measured easterly from the west line of fractional Lot 6, a distance of 31 feet, measured along the north line of said Lot 6.

2. At the North line of the first alley (20 feet wide) south of Fort Street measured from the west line of Fractional Lot 5, a distance of 25 feet, measured along the south line of said fractional Lot 5.

The lot numbers cited are those referred to in the description above.

In effect, the line thus established will be three feet westerly, more or less, from the top of the slope on the west side of Cabacier Street (the Fort-Jefferson connection). For convenience this is indicated by a line drawn in colored pencil on a drawing prepared by the Wayne County Road Commission, being Issue No. 10, dated November 25, 1949, Sheet No. 5 of Job No. 576-9 and being State Project No. XI of 82-22-16, C2. A print of this drawing is attached.

And Be It Further Resolved, That the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering and the City Engineer's office be notified of this determination of the easement for slopes and drainage facilities on the West side of Cabacier Street (Fort-Jefferson Connection).

Resolved, That all of the north-south public alley 20 feet wide in the block bounded by Hubbell, Strathmoor, Norfolk, and Chippewa Avenues, as platted in Briggs Manor Subdivision, of part of the W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan as recorded in Liber 55, Page 60 of plats, Wayne County Records, lying east of and adjoining the east line of Lots 1 to 30, both inclusive, and west of and adjoining the west line of Lots 98 to 112, both inclusive, of the last mentioned Subdivision, (Jack Singer & Son, et al, 4557).

Also, all of the east-west public alley 20 feet wide, north of Pembroke Avenue, between Pinehurst and Mendota Avenues, as platted in Blackstone Park Subdivision No. 6, of part of the N. $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 5, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., Greenfield Township, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 52, Page 92 of plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the north line of Lots 2957 to 2967, both inclusive, south of and adjoining the south line of Lots 4207 and 4308, and south of and adjoining the south line of the 18 foot vacated alley lying between Lots 4207 and 4308 of the last mentioned Subdivision, (Thomas A. Roberts, et al, 6281).

Be and the same are vacated as public alleys and are hereby converted into public easements of the full width of the alleys, which easements shall be subject to the following covenants, agreements, uses, reservations and regulations which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alleys, and by their grantees and assigns, and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever, to-wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated public alleys hereinabove described for the purpose of installing, maintaining,

repairing, removing or replacing any sewer, conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light or other poles or things usually placed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easements for the purposes above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fences) shall be built or placed upon said easements;

Third, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, such owners upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.
