Gentlemen—We have insufficient funds in our Light and Power Account to meet our bills for the balance of this fiscal year. It is estimated that we will need an additional \$4,000.

Walker & Company, to change the top portion of an existing open roof sign to a solid panel sign at 6533 E. Jefferson. The solid panel sign to be on the same frame, with the lower edge of the solid panel 20 ft. above the roof and the upper edge 39½ ft. above the roof.
