Gentlemen—As a result of numerous complaints from our Maintenance Division, the following streets have been investigated:

Kirkwood between Braden and Lar-

kins

This one-block street is a connecting link between Braden and Larkins around a playground site, and, due to a dead-end at Braden and Kirkwood, it is quite heavily traveled by cars and trucks detouring around the playground and a source of consider-

able trouble and nuisance to the department and the neighborhood.
Santa Clara, Wyoming to Pinehurst.

A letter from property owners on Washburn called our attention to the traffic and parking of Mumford High School students in the vicinity of Santa Clara Avenue which is unpaved, poorly drained and causes flooding of sidewalks and yards. We have discussed this matter with the Department of Streets and Traffic who concur in our conclusion that this street should be force paved and would prove beneficial to the neighborhood.

Chalfonte from Dexter to Livernois. This street involves heavy maintenance costs since it is the route of the Dexter bus loop, and there are two churches located adjacent to the street which results in quite heavy traffic during certain periods of the week and should be paved.

It is our recommendation that all three of these street be paved under the force paving clause of the City Charter in accordance with the following resolution. The Department of Streets and Traffic has been con-

sulted and concurs.
