## Department of Public Works May 23, 1958.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen: On November 8, 1955, your Honorable Body adopted a resolution approving the resurfacing of Avenue (US-112) from Michigan Woodward Avenue to Wyoming Avenue, and providing for the City's share of the cost. This work was programmed in stages. The resurfacing has been completed from Wyoming Avenue easterly to Fifth Street. The improvements between Fifth Street and Woodward Avenue will be somewhat different than originally planned.

Because of an unsatisfactory condition at intersections of Michigan Avenue with Griswold Street, Shelby Street, and Washington Boulevard, and because of the difference in elevations between the north and south curbs, which would create an unsatisfactory transverse crown condi-tion, it has been agreed by this office and the State Highway Department to reconstruct entirely that portion of Michigan Avenue between Woodward Avenue and Abbott Street, and to resurface over the existing street that portion of Michigan Avenue between Fifth Street and Abbott Street.

In addition, since November 8, 1955, change has been effected in the Highway Law, Act 262, Public Acts of 1957, amending Act 51, Public Acts of 1951, which provides that the City's share of participation in trunkline improvements is reduced to 25% after Federal-aid participation

The estimated cost of the entire work is \$500,000.00. Federal-aid will be applied, and after such deduction, the City's share of the participation will be an estimated amount of \$62,-500. Funds have been provided in Account No. 143-2128-964 to this estimated cost.

For the reasons indicated, it is necessary that the City adopt a new resoltuion in order to permit the completion of the improvement needed on Michigan Avenue between Fifth Street and Woodward Avenue. This work is scheduled for letting by the Highway Department shortly.

Accordingly, we recommend adoption of the attached resolution.
