Resolved, That all of the east-west public alley, 16 feet wide, lying northerly of the intersection of Electric

Avenue and Outer Drive 150 feet wide as now established, as platted in Victory Park Subdivision of part of P.C. 61 north of Pepper Road Village of Oakwood, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 39, Page 30 of Plats Wayne County Records, lying southerly of and adjoining the southerly line of the easterly 92.69 feet of lot 1 of the above-mentioned subdivision. (Florence V. Sydner, 14)

Also all of the north-south public alley, 16 feet wide, north of Winchester Avenue between Anglin and Harned Avenues, as platted in Fox and O'Connors Subdivision of the north 32.50 acres of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, lying east of Conant Road, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., Hamtramck Township, Wayne County, Michigan as recorded in Liber 35, Page 47 of Plats Wayne County Records and in Rose-Rossin Subdivision of part of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 72, Page 10 of Plats Wayne County Records, lying west of and adjoining the west line of Lots 18 to 24, both inclusive, east of and adjoining the east line of lot 25 to 31, both inclusive, of the last mentioned subdivision, west of and adjoining the west line of lot 133, west of and adjoining the west line of the south 15 feet of lot 134, east of and adjoining the east line of lot 158 and east of and adjoining the east line of the south 15 feet of lot 157 of the above-mentioned Fox and O'Connors Subdivision. Also all of the alley turn-around north of Winchester Avenue between Anglin and Harned Avenues which was deeded to the City of Detroit said deed having been accepted by the Common Council on August 17, 1954, said turn-around being in fact the east 14.5 feet of lot 158, the east 14.5 feet of the south 15 feet of lot 157, the west 14.5 feet of lot 133 and the west 14.5 feet of the south 15 feet of lot 134 of Fox and O'Connor's Subdivision of the N. 32.50 acres of the N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, lying E. of Conant Road, as recorded in Liber 35, Page 47 of Plats, Wayne County Records. (Nancy Pawlukiewicz, et al, 10695)

Also all of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, westerly of Yosemite Avenue southerly of Kay Avenue, as platted in Ravenswood Subdivision of $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 30 and 31 of 10,000 A.T., T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 10, Page 81 of Plats Wayne County Records, lying southerly of and adjoining the southerly line of lot 1 and northerly of and adjoining the northerly line of lot 30 of the above mentioned subdivision, said alley also being described as lying between the westerly line of Yosemite Avenue and a line extended from the southwesterly corner of lot 1 to the

northwesterly corner of lot 30 of said Ravenswood Subdivision. (Agnes H. Gandy, et al, 172)

Also all of the east-west public alley, 14 feet wide east of Cadieux Avenue between Cincinnati and Waverly Avenues as platted in Block 6 of Columbia Friends Subdivision of lots 26 to 33, inclusive, of Michael Cadieux Estate, Private Claims 506 and 564, Grosse Pointe, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 17, Page 93 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying southerly of and adjoining the southerly line of lots 8 to 25, both inclusive, and northerly of and adjoining the northerly line of lots 26 to 43, both inclusive, of the above-mentioned subdivision. (Ernest Von Tobel, et al, 840).

Be and the same are vacated as public alleys and are hereby converted into public easements of the full width of the alleys, which easements shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations and regulations which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alleys and by their grantees and assigns, and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever to-wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated public alleys hereinabove described for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing or replacing any sewer conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light or other poles or things usually placed or installed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time, to and over said easements for the purposes above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fences) shall be built or placed upon said easements;

Third, if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, such owners upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.
