AN ORDINANCE to amend sections 4 and 5 of Chapter 136 of the Com-piled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1954.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That sections 4 and 5 of Chapter 136 of the Compiled Ordi-nances of the City of Detroit for the year 1954 be, and the same are hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 4 (A) It shall be unlawful for

any minor twelve (12) years of age and under ceventeen (17) FOURTEEN (14) years of age to loiter, idle, wander, stroll or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds, wharves, docks or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, THEATRES AND MOVIE HOUSES, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other unsupervised places between the hours of =2 midnight ELEVEN (11) P.M. and 6 A.M. the following day, excepting on Pridays, when the hours chall be 1 A.M. to 6 A.M. of the following day, city time, excepting no minor twelve (12) years of age age shall be permitted to remain in theatre or moving pleture show after the hour of 11 P.M.;
