Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen — In accordance with resolutions adopted by your Honorable Body, the following agreement and encroachment bonds have been filed with this office.

Agreement: S. S. Kresge Company—Permittee, City of Detroit—Obligee. Covers permit to install a fence with black top on one side and landscaping on the other, on public property between the sidewalk and property line in front of their proposed employees parking lot on the north side of Temple, east of Third, authorized October 21, 1958, J.C.C. 2232-33.

Encroachment bonds: Perry L. and Lorraine Webster, d/b/a Websters Open Hearth Bar B Que—Principal Great American Indemnity Co. of New York—Surety, Amount \$10,000. Covers permit to install a stone facing on store building at 2934 Mt. Elliott, said facing to encroach one inch into Mt. Covers permit to erect power operated hoists on public property, behind barricades, and maintain same for such temporary period of time as is necessary in connection with cornice removal work: On Griswold St., adjacent to the Dime Building, and later on the Fort St. side; (NW corner Griswold & Fort); (Petn. No. 2730), authorized October 14, 1958, J.C.C. 2181-82.

Wayne Circuit Court Number 298-812, Location, Lanark, Evanston, Guilford and Woodhall Avenues, Common Council Petition No. 13066.
