Gentlemen—This is to advise your Honorable Body that on November 26, 1958, an order was entered by the Honorable Frank Fitzgerald, Circuit Judge, dismissing the petition for vacating the public alley in the following case:

Wayne Circuit Court Number 299-778; Location: Morang, Rex, Eastwood and Fordham Avenues; Common Council Petition No. 14111.

The petition was dismissed as a number of the abutting property owners, who previously requested the closing of the alley, had since changed their minds and no longer desired the vacation of the alley, resulting in a percentage of 59% of the abutting owners requesting the closing.

The petition was dismissed without prejudice to the right of the City to petition for vacation of the alley above mentioned at a later date upon a showing that the required percentage of abutting property owners favor and request the same.

Gentlemen—Contract AC-6 is for Electric System Improvements—Institute of Arts. Blackburn Electric Company is the Contractor.

After the work was started, it was deemed advisable to install lighting fixtures, lamps, special outlets, together with the necessary wiring and switches, in the photographic studio which were not included in the original work under this Contract.
