Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen — We are returning herewith the petition of Frank Hoffman No. 1611, requesting the vacation of the north-south public alley west of Van Dyke Avenue between Walbridge Avenue and the Edsel Ford Expressway. The vacation of said alley was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive the petitioner paid into the City Treasury the sum of \$201.22, Receipt No. A-16992, credited to the Street Maintenance Fund Code No. 143-0000 (624), said amount being the original cost of paving the south ½ of Walbridge Avenue at the intersection of the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner on October 29, 1958, deposited with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$3,000.00, Receipt No. GR-1421, said amount being the estimated cost of constructing a new sewer in lieu of the sewer now located in the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$650.00, Receipt No. GR-1420, said amount being the estimated cost of removing the paved alley return at the entrance to the alley to be vacated south of Walbridge Avenue, west of Van Dyke Avenue and constructing straight curb and sidewalk incident to such removal.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said alley or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen — In response to published advertisements, five bids were received on October 20, 1958, for the Algonquin Avenue Outlet Sewer Contract PW-2106, as listed on the attached tabulation.

The low bid was regular and in accordance with the Contract requirements. It is, therefore, recommended that the Contract be awarded to the low bidder, S. A. Healy Company and Gargaro Company, Inc., as a joint venture, in the amount of \$3,881,000.00.

In addition to the Contract price, it is estimated that \$135,250.00 will be required for advertising, inspection, and minor contingencies, and \$4,500.00 will be required to cover the cost of City utility work, making the total funds required \$4,020,750.00, which are available in Account 925-2383-953.
