Municipal Association in presenting testimony pertaining to appropriations to carry out the highway program on schedule.

The bills being considered are of vital importance to Detroit as well as all the other urban areas where federal highways are now being built. Revenues from highway-users taxes are ear-marked for this federal program, but it is apparent that they will not be sufficient during the next two years to carry out the program as approved in the Highway Act.

Bills are now before Congress which provide temporary financing so that the program can be continued. The Mayor has approved my representing the American Municipal Association at these hearings in Washington, D. C., on Thursday, May 7, 1959.
