Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen-Your Honorable Body, on December 11, 1958, authorized the City Engineer to plan a lateral sewer to serve property located between the alley west of Algonac and the Grand Trunk Railroad and south of Manning Avenue extended. (J.C.C. 2531, '58).

It will be necessary to secure a sewer easement in private land that is interposed between the available public sewer and the unsewered properties. The route chosen for the proposed sewer, in addition to being the most expeditious, will also benefit the greater number of land parcels which do not have sewer service available at this time. The description of the necessary right-of-way is as follows:

All that part of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 3, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., beginning at a point in the E. line of Outer Drive, being also on the E. line of the Grand Trunk Western R.R. right-of-way, thence N. 28d 36m 40s E., a distance of 1267.25 feet along the E. line of said railroad right-of-way to a point; thence S. 0d 53m 45s E., a distance of 534.56 feet to a point; thence S. 28d 36m 40s W., a distance of 781.95 feet to a point, thence S. 87d 36m 00s W., a distance of 202.13 feet, along the N. line of Lappin Avenue, 60 feet wide, to a point; thence N. 18d 21m 40s W., a distance of 123.18 feet, along the line of Outer Drive, to the point of beginning.

It is, therefore, my recommendation that you authorize the Corporation Counsel to acquire the necessary rights in this private land for the establishment of the sewer easement.
