We wish to advise that our investi-

gations are completed.

The petitioner deposited with the City Treasurer the sum of \$666.47, Receipt No. C-11683, credited to the Department of Water Supply, Fund Code No. 600-6232-001, said amount being the remaining equity and the estimated cost of abandoning an existing 6-inch water main located in said West End Avenue to be vacated.

The Sewer Design Division of the Department of Public Works requested a sewer right-of-way across the petitioner's property in lieu of the vacated West End Avenue right-ofway. Allied Chemical Corporation has submitted a satisfactory agreement, which establishes the new sewer right-of-way. The acceptance of said agreement was authorized by your Honorable Body on October 4, 1960, J.C.C. Page 2021, and has been re-corded in Liber 14318, Page 633 of Deeds Wayne County Records.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies re-ported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said street or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

You have asked for an opinion from this office on the legality of closing any street leading to the

The Legislature enacted P.A. 1927 (9.51 to 9.56 M.S.A.) to prevent the abondonment, discontinuance or alteration of the course of any public highway which borders upon or is adjacent to, or any portion thereof lying (within five (5) rods of the shore of any lake or the general course of any stream) by or-der of any official or any officials of any township, city or incorporated village in this State until an order authorizing the same shall have been made by the Circuit Court of the County in which such highway is situated in the manner therein provided.

The City Charter is subject to the provisions of the Constitution and the Statutes of the State of Michigan. Therefore before your Honorable Body can close or vacate any street leading to or any portion of such street which is adjacent to navigable waters as defined by the provisions of the Statute cited; it is necessary that a Circuit Court order of authorization be first secured so as to comply with the procedure and requirements of said Statute.
