Resolved, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, in the block bounded by Dalrymple, Nardin, Bordeaux, and Collingwood Avenues, as platted in Nardin Park Subdivision on the N.W. Fractional ¼ of Fractional Section 34 and the S.W. Part of ¼ Section 30 and W. Part of ¼ Section 31 of the 10,000 Acre Tract, Greenfield (now City of Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan as recorded in Liber 26, Page 96 of Plats, lying east of and adjoining the easterly line of Lot 96, west of and adjoining the westerly line of Lots 86 and 87, and lying west of and adjoining the westerly line of the northerly 40.00 feet of Lot 88, all of the above mentioned subdivision. (C. Charles Harvey, et al. No. 10438).

Also, all that part of the north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, north

of Jefferson Avenue, between Pelham and Swain Avenues as platted in the Plat of Bela Hubbards' Subdivision of P. C. 77, N. of River Street and S. of Fort Street, Springwells (now City of Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 5, Page 46 of Plats, Wayne County Records lying east of and adjoining the easterly line of Lots 48 to 50 both inclusive, and west of and adjoining the westerly line of Lots 51 to 53 both inclusive, all of the above mentioned subdivision.

Also, all that part of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, north of Jefferson Avenue, between Pelham and Swain Avenues as platted in the Plat of Bela Hubbard's Subdivision of P. C. 77, N. of River Street, S. of Fort Street, Springwells (now City of Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 5, Page 46 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying south of and adjoining the southerly line of the easterly 38.00 feet of Lot 50 and south of and adjoining the southerly line of the 20-foot alley adjoining said Lot 50, and lying north of and adjoining the northerly line of the easterly 9.00 feet of Lot 9, north of and adjoining the northerly line of Lots 7 and 8, and north of and adjoining the northerly line of the westerly 9.00 feet of Lot 6, all of the above mentioned subdivision. (Humill, Inc., No. 11029).

Be and the same are vacated as public alleys and are hereby converted into public easements of the full width of the alleys, which easements shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations, and regulations which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alley and by their grantees and assigns, and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever to wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated public alley hereinabove described for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing, or replacing any sewer, conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light or other poles or things usually placed or installed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easement for the purposes above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fences) shall be built upon said easement;

Third, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated public alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities

in said easement, such owners upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.
