Honorable Common Council: June 8, 1962. Gentlemen—On November 17, the City of Detroit entered into an agreement to purchase and develop Parcel 8 in the Lafayette Project,

Mich. R-12, with Center City Developers, Inc., which agreement has been assigned with the consent of the City to Nathan B. Goodnow, Paul R. Trigg, Jr., and James W. Draper, Trustees, under a Certain Indenture of Trust.

In the proposed construction of a multi-story apartment building on Parcel 8, the developers found it necessary to request approval of your Honorable Body to grant an easement in the easterly 20 feet of the Central Park area of the Lafayette Development Project for the relocation of gas main located in Parcel 8. This approval has been granted.

The developers now find that in granting a similar private easement to the Gas Company to service their building in Parcel 8, they must provide an 8 foot easement from newly relocated gas line in the aforementioned easement in the park area.
