3) Provided, If at any time in the future it becomes necessary to repair or replace the sewers or other utilities located or to be located in said easement, by the acceptance of this permission, the owners for themselves, their heirs and assigns, waive claims for any damages to the encroaching installations and agree to pay the costs incurred in their removal, if their removal becomes necessary, and to restore the property affected to a condition satisfactory to the Department of Public Works at the owners' expense, and further

4) Provided, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council, and the grantees by the acceptance of this permission waive any rights to claim damages or compensation for any driveways or structures constructed and maintained hereunder, or for removal of the same, and they acquire no implied nor any other privileges not expressly stated herein.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of the Board of Education, No. 1135, requesting the vacation of the alley in the block bounded by Sheridan Avenue, Townsend Avenue, Lafayette Avenue and Agnes Avenue within the limits of the Field Replacement School Site. The vacation of said alley was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive, the petitioner issued a purchase order, No. 3394, in the amount of \$1,500.00, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Sewer Design Bureau, to cover the costs of constructing a new manhole and intercepting an existing catch basin line.

The petitioner also issued a purchase order, No. 3395, in the amount of \$261.86, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Design Bureau,

said amount being the original cost of paving the south one-half of Agnes Avenue and the north one-half of Lafayette Avenue at the intersection of the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner also issued a purchase order, No. 3396, in the amount of \$933.00, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Maintenance Division, to cover the costs of removing the paved alley returns, constructing new curb and walk and backfilling where necessary.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by said vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.
