Gentlemen — We return herewith petition of Joseph L. Dodson, et al, 5620 Stahelin Ave., Detroit 28, Michigan, requesting the forced construction of sidewalks at the following described locations:

Lots 9 to 12 Incl., N.S. Ford Rd. between Brace and Stahelin, fronts only; 190.5 lineal feet.

There is approximately 190.5 lineal feet of concrete sidewalks to be constructed; the approximate cost of this new local improvement would be \$628.65, the cost and expense to be assessed against such lots or parcels of real estate to be benefitted by such local improvement in proportion to the probable benefit to be derived therefrom.

As these are original sidewalks and can only be ordered constructed by a formal resolution as a forced account under the provisions of Chapter 264, as amended May 3, 1949, of the Compiled Ordinances, we recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of the Board of Education, No. 9282, requesting the vacation of the alleys in the block bounded by Dubois, Chene, Scott, and Hale Streets. The vacation of said alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive, the petitioner issued a Purchase Order No. 97947, in the amount of \$1,100.00, in favor of the Public Lighting Commission, to cover the costs of removing and relocating P.L.C. facilities necessitated by the vacation of said alleys.

The petitioner also issued a Purchase Order No. 97948, in the amount of \$1,785.00, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Maintenance Division, to cover the costs of removing the paved alley returns, constructing new curb and walk, and backfilling where necessary.

The petitioner also issued a Purchase Order No. 97949, in the amount of \$320.28, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Design Bureau, said amount being the original cost of paving the north one-half of Scott Street, the south one-half of Hale Street, and the east one-half of Dubois Street at the intersections of the alleys to be vacated.

All other City Departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said alleys or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.
