Gentlemen---The above claims resulted from injuries sustained at the Detroit City Airport on October 6. 1962. Mr. Raymond Brennan and his two sons, Terry and Robert, had gone to the airport to witness the arrival of President Kennedy on that date. The Brennans and other spectators were standing on a conduit running along the iron fence when said conduit gave away. As a result thereof, Robert Brennan received a minor laceration. Raymond Brennan and Terry Brennan sustained serious injuries

Raymond Brennan incurred special damages by way of lost wages and medical expenses of approximately \$1800 and Terry Brennan's hospitalization costs amounted to some \$350.

Suit was instituted in this matter prior to our making any recommendation on this claim. During the pendency of this suit, settlement discussions were had and resulted in an offer of settlement in the amount of \$5500 for all three cases.

We feel the acceptance of this offer to be in the best interests of the City of Detroit and, therefore, request your Honorable Body to direct the Controller to issue drafts as follows:
