Gentlemen-We are returning herewith the petition of the Board of Education No. 4376, requesting the vacation of a portion of Fort Street east of Elmwood Avenue and the alleys north and south of Fort Street east of Elmwood Avenue within the limits of the new Eastern High School. The vacation of said portion of street and alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission with the recommendation that sufficient land be dedicated for a new street and alley outlet for the portion of Fort Street which is to remain open. The petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investi-

gations are completed.

As per our directive, the petitioner issued a Purchase Order, No. 039924, in the amount of \$7,500.00 in favor of the Department of Water Supply, said amount being the estimated cost of abandoning an existing water main located in the portion of Fort Street to be vacated and constructing a new water main in the newly dedicated street.

The petitioner also issued a Purchase Order, No. 039926, in the amount of \$1,600.00, in favor of the Detroit Fire Department, said amount being the estimated cost of removing or relocating three fire hydrants from the area to be vacated.

The petitioner also issued a Purchase Order, No. 039927, in the amount of \$2,850.00, in favor of the of Fort Street, east of Elmwood Avec

Public Lighting Commission, Lighting Division, said amount being the estimated cost of removing and rerouting primary and street lighting equipment from the street and alleys to be vacated.

The petitioner also issued a Purchase Order, No. 039928, in the amount of \$664.50 in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Design Bureau, said amount being the original cost of paving the streets at the intersection of the street and alleys to be vacated.

The petitioner also issued a Pur-Order, No. 039929, in the chase amount of \$14,805.00, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Maintenance Division, said amount being the estimated cost of removing the paved street and alley returns, constructing new curb and walk, and paving the newly deeded street and allev.

Proper provisions are incorporated in the vacating resolution protecting the Citys interest in the sewer located

in the alleys to be vacated.

We are in receipt of Quit Claim

Deeds from the petitioner to the City of Detroit deeding land for a new street outlet into Lafayette Avenue and a new alley outlet south of Fort Street in accordance with the recommendation of the City Plan Commission. Said deeds were approved as to form and execution by the Corporation Counsel and as to description by the City Engineer and are attached hereto for your Honorable Body's acceptance.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said street and alleys or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations

therein.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Gentlemen — Contract PW-4565, is for the paving of St. Aubin from Lafayette to Jay—Elmwood Park Rehabilitation Project No. 1, Mich. R-40. L. A. Davidson is the Contractor.

At the time this job was designed, the Site Plans of the individual developers, indicating the proposed street pattern, were not available. The street pattern has now been devoloped, but this requires that certain Island openings be relocated to place them in line with the new street returns. Certain grade and drainage changes are also necessary.

The Contractor has quoted a price of \$2,554.82, for this work on the basis of Contract Unit Prices, which is subject to adjustment when final quantities are known. This price has been checked by the City Engineer and is considered to be fair and

reasonable.
