Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petition of the Board of Education, No. 6698, requesting the vacation of a portion of the east-west public alley, 18 feet wide, south of Sylvester Avenue between Belvidere and McClellan Avenues. The vacation of said portion of alley was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive, the petitioner issued a purchase order, No. 050520, in the amount of \$710.00, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Maintenance Division, to cover the costs of removing the paved alley return, constructing a new curb and walk, and backfilling where necessary at the entrance to the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner also issued a purchase order, No. 050521, in the amount of \$147.78, in favor of the Department of Public Works, Street Design Bureau, said amount being the original cost of paving the east one-half of Belvidere Avenue at the Intersection of the alley to be vacated.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said alley, or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.
